Whatever our age, we are pained to hear that this vital work with younger Friends could go away just when they may need support the most—and when older Friends are wondering who will carry our Quaker values and good works into the future. The pandemic, the political climate, the economic uncertainty all show us how much we need one another and the New York Yearly Meeting that connects us—including many who have no access to a monthly meeting.

We are very grateful that the Young Adult Field Secretary position is funded through 2020 and that Marissa is able to continue to do this remarkable work through this year, but **we cannot even consider hiring a replacement until we know—in good conscience—that the position can be funded in 2021** and with a strong sense that it can continue to be funded for two years beyond that.

The Development Committee is reaching out from now until mid-September for a commitment of **at least \$50,000 in new donations** that will allow us to start advertising the position. It's a big number, but not if LOTS of us invest what we can in our future.

The Committee hopes you'll attend an Interest Group Gathering to find out how YOU can help and why. **Drop in when you can with your questions** (e.g. What would my gift support? What are some creative and do-able alternatives to writing NYYM a check? Can I pledge now and pay later? Can you tell me how to put NYYM in my will?). It's **TONIGHT (Wed.) between 7:00 and 9:00 p.m.** at [this link](#). You don't have to love money to celebrate what it can do for our younger Friends and for all of us!

Reflections from Sunday's Meeting for Grieving and Healing

During Sunday's **Meeting for Grieving and Healing**, we named together some of the ways that grief is showing up in our lives and in the world. Our griefs form a vast and varied landscape, ranging from traumatic losses such as the death of a loved one or the ending of an intimate relationship, to more ambiguous griefs such as our assumptions about what the rest of our lives would be like. Our hearts are breaking because of what we are seeing in our communities and in the world, some things for the first time, many things for far too long. We may also be grieving for our self-image: if we can no longer do work we found fulfilling, or if we are seeing ourselves in new ways as we gain insights into how our previously unconscious ways impact other people. We shared different ways we can process these many kinds of griefs, by ourselves and in community. We heard that, as we process and move thru our griefs, we may release some, but others become a part of who we are.

Quote: We must treat grief as worthy of attention. In fact, it is essential for us to welcome our grief whatever form it takes. When we do, we open ourselves to our shared experiences in life. Grief is our common bond. Opening to our sorrow connects us with everyone, everywhere.
